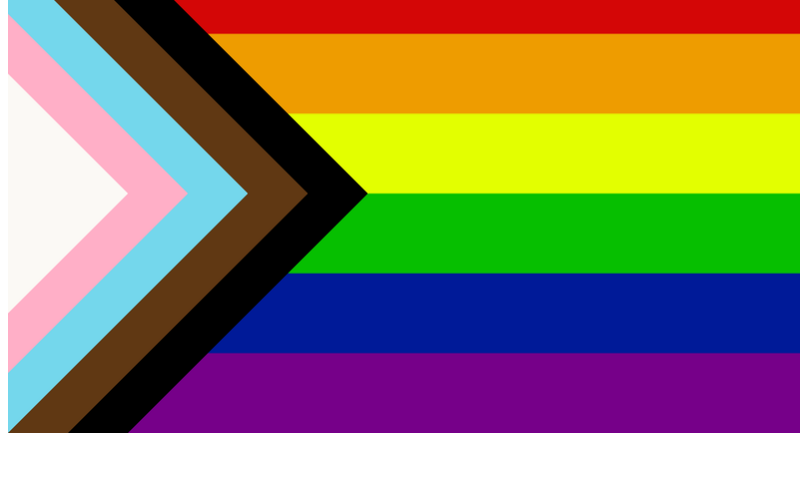


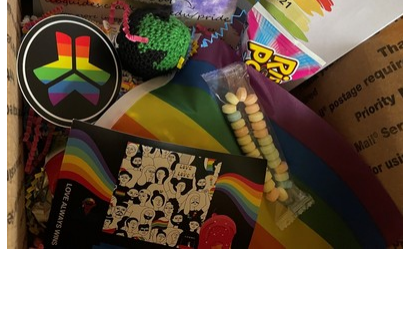


Happy LGBTQ+ Pride Month!

Pride month arose out of the 1969 Stonewall uprising against police harassment and persecution of LGBTQ+ people in the United States. Juneteenth

Juneteenth is a holiday celebrated across the country on June 19, commemorating the end of slavery in the United States. This year, the Oregon legislature passed House Bill 2168, which will make Juneteenth an official state holiday beginning in

2022. Juneteenth was also just approved by Congress to become a federal holiday.

REMEMBERING THE JUNE REVOLUTIONS

FROM JUNETEENTH TO STONEWALL

JUNE IS A MILESTONE MONTH. IT IS IMPORTANT TO RECOGNIZE THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THIS MONTH.

- 1865**

Juneteenth
On June 19, 1865, Union soldiers brought news of the Emancipation Proclamation and end of the Civil War to the remaining slaves in Galveston, Texas.
- 1921**

Tulsa, OK Race Riots
The arrest of a black man named Dick Rowland sparked a confrontation between armed black and white mobs. The Greenwood district, also known as the Black Wall Street, was looted, burned and destroyed by white rioters early on June 1, 1921.
- 1969**

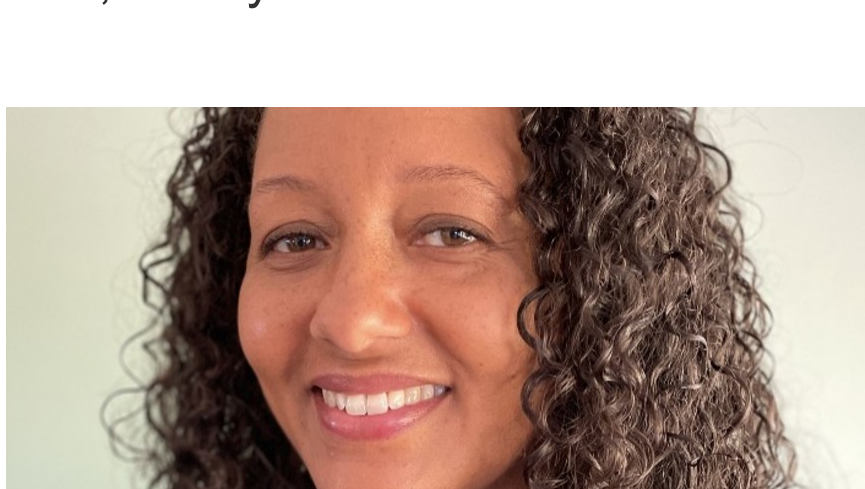
Stonewall and Pride
On June 28, 1969, police raided the Stonewall Inn, a gay club located in Greenwich Village in New York City. The raid sparked a riot among bar patrons and neighborhood residents as police roughly hauled employees and patrons out of the bar.
- 2020**

Protests for George Floyd
On June 2, 2020, a week after George Floyd was murdered by a Minneapolis police officer, protestors gathered at the site where he died. Protests across the country continued for weeks and months.

Join a DEI subcommittee

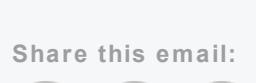
Joining a DEI subcommittee is a great way to help advance DEI efforts at CCC. Subcommittees include:

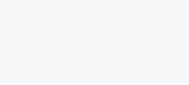
